**Position Title: Aboriginal Infant Development Consultant**

The AIDP Consultant works with children and families utilizing a family-centered approach in a home visiting program. The AIDP Consultant is responsible for supporting infant and child development together with the infant/child's family during home visits and work with related professionals and agencies, maintains a caseload, and provides playgroup facilitation as needed.

Working as part of the VNFC Aboriginal Infant Development (AIDP) Team, the AIDP consultant and reports directly to the AIDP Team Manager. The AIDP Consultant will attend home visits with families of children aged infancy to preschool to assess child development and plan programming with parents that stimulates and enhances optimal development, monitor progress, and provide support.

Our team includes people of all Indigenous identities; some who are close to their communities and others who are on a path to learn more about their heritage. In recognition of the importance of a lived understanding of Indigenous communities, history, values and culture, preference is given to Indigenous applicants. **Please self-identify in your cover letter.**
