The Aboriginal Supported Child Development (ASCD) Consultant provides outreach services to Indigenous, First Nations and Métis children with extra needs living in urban settings and caregivers in supporting the optimal physical, cognitive, emotional, spiritual and cultural development of their children. The ASCD Consultant works as part of the VNFC Aboriginal Supported Child Development and Neurodiversity (ASCDN) Team, and reports directly to the ASCDN Team Manager.

The ASCD Consultant is able to work from a trauma-informed lens to develop child-specific, family-centred and developmentally appropriate individual plans in conjunction with parents and childcare providers and in accordance with the choices, priorities and goals identified by the parents and/or childcare providers.

Our team includes people of all Indigenous identities; some who are close to their communities and others who are on a path to learn more about their heritage. In recognition of the importance of a lived understanding of Indigenous communities, history, values and culture, preference is given to Indigenous applicants. **Please self-identify in your cover letter.**
