#### Successes

- 1. The VNFC Housing team hosted their first "Gimmie Shelter" train the trainer course.
- 2. They hosted an expecting single mother facing a two-month eviction on one of the Gulf Islands. She sought our help to find housing here in Victoria. We were able to secure her a market rental, a Midwife, food hampers, and a referral for a long-term cultural housing subsidy. She will be giving birth any day now and will have a safe place to bring her little one home to.
