Working as part of the VNFC Management Team and reporting directly to the Director of Family Development and Food Security, the Family Wellness Supports (FWS) Team Manager provides both strategic and operational leadership to the FWS Team. This position provides supervision, leadership and support to staff within the FWS Team and will ensure that the work of the team is well integrated and managed to the benefit of the clients/ community served. Requires Bachelor's degree from a four-year college or university in Social Work of Child and Youth Care; and/or two to four years' related experience and/or training; or equivalent combination of education and experience.
