Position Title: Indigenous Wellness Provider - PCN

Working as part of the interdisciplinary VNFC Wellness Team and reporting directly to the Indigenous Lead (PCN), the Indigenous Wellness Provider (IWP) supports VNFC and Primary Care Network (PCN) clients to coordinate and access Indigenous practitioners, primary health care, social services, and specialized medical care. IWP provide support to Indigenous peoples in the Victoria and Western PCNs including Métis, Inuit, status and non-status First Nations. The IWP will work with people experiencing a range of barriers to health care. This position requires a class 5 driver's license, clean driver's abstract, and your own vehicle. Use of your vehicle to transport community members is a requirement of the position.

Our competitive compensation package includes extended cost-shared benefits and a pension plan. Our team includes people of all Indigenous identities; some who are close to their communities and others who are on a path to learn more about their heritage. In recognition of the importance of a lived understanding of Indigenous communities, history, values and culture, preference is given to Indigenous applicants. **Please self-identify in your cover letter.**

Applicants must be permanent residents able to work legally in Canada, with all positions located in Victoria, BC. VNFC is unable to sponsor employment visas or offer work permits or remote work at this time.
